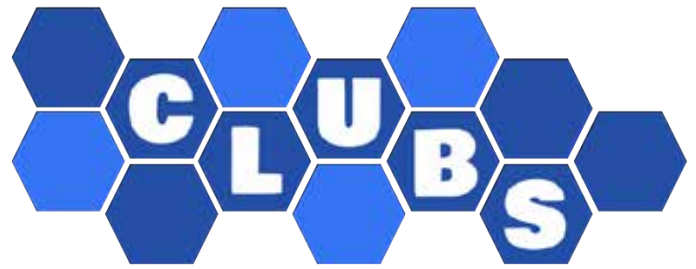

K9 Veterans Day Observed

The Humane Society of Live Oak recognized the heroic contribution, service and sacrifices that K9 Veterans make for our country by hosting a celebration ceremony on March 13th in their honor. A dozen K9 handlers and service dogs were on hand to receive certificates from the Humane Society for their tireless contributions. These included representatives from nine area police departments, and two rescues specializing in rehoming & rehabilitating retired military working dogs.



The movement to celebrate the lives of these 4-legged heroes was started by former military dog handler, Joe White. The holiday is meant to commemorate all dogs who serve in the military, law enforcement, explosive detection, therapy, and many other areas of service, and is celebrated on the birthday of the US Army K9 Corps—March 13th, 1942. While not currently recognized as an official holiday, there is legislation working to make K9 Veterans Day



a state & national observance. A huge “thank you” to all that attended the first annual K9 Veterans Day Celebration, and we look forward to recognizing K9 Veterans Day for many years to come.

Protecting Our Fur Babies

The summer months are usually filled with outdoor fun in the sun for us humans. But when thinking of summer outdoor activities, we sometimes forget to think about the health and welfare of our pets left out exposed to the Texas heat. Statistics show that the summer months become busier for Animal Control officers with a growing number of calls about animals left out in the heat or worse, in a locked hot vehicle. We wanted to take this opportunity to remind everyone that similar to humans, it only takes a few minutes for animals to dehydrate or suffer a heat stroke. If you have an outdoor fur baby, please remember to leave plenty of water and provide ample shade for them to cool off in while you are away.

WITHIN MINUTES INTERIOR CAR TEMPS CAN BE DEADLY!

Be mindful of the asphalt and concrete temperatures during your strolls with your animals. You may not be affected but thermal contact burns from asphalt and concrete sidewalks can severely harm your pet's paws. Exercise your pets early in the morning or late at night to make the walk more comfortable for both you and your fur baby. By providing these helpful tips on heat awareness together we will keep our Live Oak animals safe. Help us keep our animal rescue numbers low this summer!

STOP!

Press the back of your hand firmly against the asphalt for 7 seconds; to verify it will be comfortable for your dog.

Hot Asphalt Awareness

When the air temperature is this, asphalt has been measured at this.*

Air Temperature	Asphalt Temperature
77°	125°
86°	135°
87°	143°

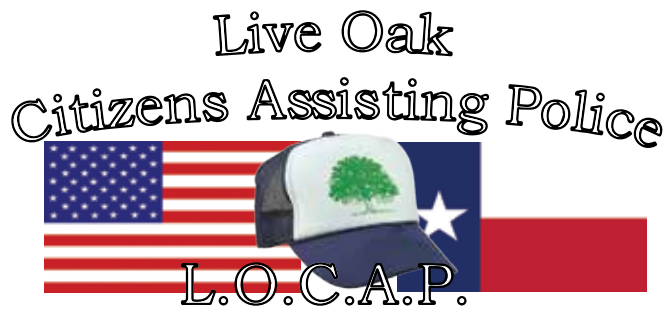
*These temperature correlations represent worst scenario variables: direct sun, no wind, very low humidity, and high radiant energy.

At 125° F, skin destruction can occur in 60 seconds.
An egg can fry in 5 minutes at 131° F.

Did you know that May is National Water Safety Month?

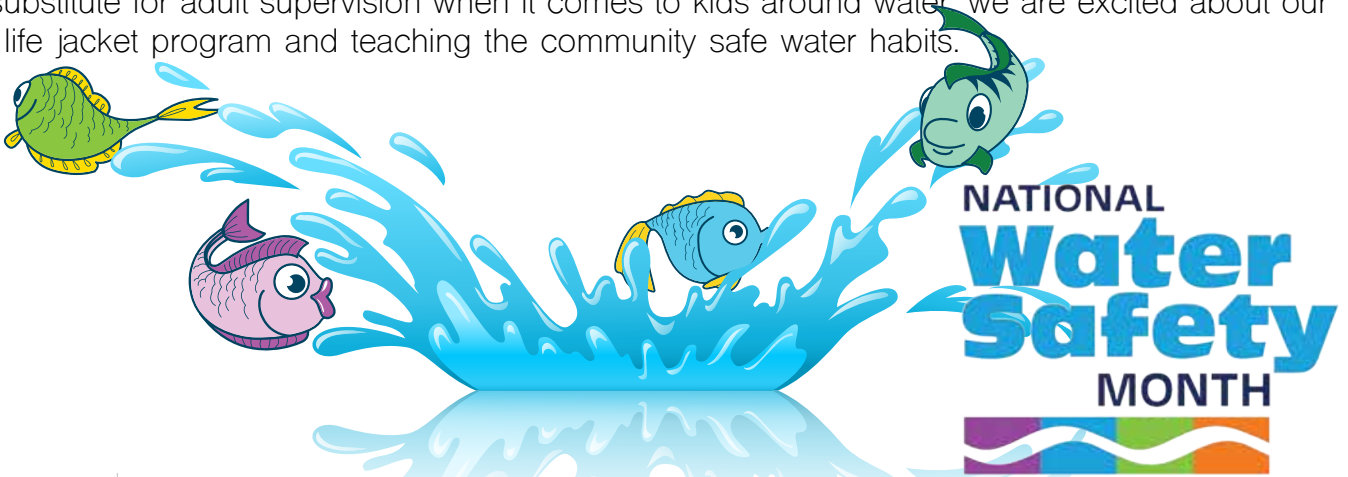

We recognize the importance of having U.S. Coast Guard approved flotation devices available to the community and are pleased to offer this service. Parents that bring children to the pool will be able to borrow a life jacket free of charge, and return at the end of their swim time. The Aquatics Staff will be available to help parents properly fit their children for a life jacket, and answer questions pertaining to sizing guidelines. Although there is NO substitute for adult supervision when it comes to kids around water, we are excited about our F.I.S.H. life jacket program and teaching the community safe water habits.

Know Your Flood Risk

We are fortunate this year to have an abundance of rainfall; however, our area is prone to flash flooding. The State of Texas leads the nation in flood-related fatalities. The first step in preventing flood-related fatalities and the damages caused by flooding is knowing your flood risk.

In 2004, Live Oak joined The Bexar Regional Watershed Management (BRWM) partners — Bexar County, the City of San Antonio, the San Antonio River Authority and 20 suburban cities in Bexar County. As funding partners, we undertook a comprehensive effort to update the County's flood risk maps which resulted in a more accurate depiction of the flood risk in Bexar County. In addition to converting the maps to a digital format, the BRWM updated flood studies and re-mapped many areas of the floodplain that had not been mapped since the 1970's.

In March 2010, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) approved the new Digital Flood Insurance Rate Maps for Bexar County. That means the floodplain maps for your area might have changed based on these more up-to-date flood studies.

Live Oak has since updated the city's existing flood ordinance. If you haven't done so, please log on to www.bexarfloodfacts.org and check the new flood maps to determine how the changes may impact our city and your property. If your property is near a drainage ditch or stream, please help do your part of keeping the area free of brush and debris. Summer BBQ Safety Checklist

Gathering family and friends for a backyard BBQ is a rite of passage in Texas. In order to stay safe during summer BBQs, stop and take some simple preventive measures to keep your family out of harm's way before your next barbecue. Here are a few Dos and Don'ts to keep you and your guest from becoming a statistic:

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- Keep your grill placed away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grill and the tray below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended. Keep children and pets at least three-feet away from the grill area.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.
- Never leave propane tank in your vehicle. Heat, sunlight and motion can increase pressure, creating a flammable and explosive environment.
- Propane gas leaks are indicated by the distinct odor of rotten eggs in the air. If you smell this, remove all sources of flame from the area and repair or replace any defective parts.
- If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 15 minutes before re-lighting it.
- If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

“Stop the Pop Reminder”

The Live Oak Fire Department would like to remind everyone that Live Oak has an Ordinance in effect that makes fireworks illegal to discharge or even have in your possession within the City limits. The City will continue to enforce compliance with state law and local city ordinance, in respect to fireworks and fire and safety regulations this July 4th. **If a minor is caught with fireworks, the parent or guardian will receive the fine even if they were unaware of the minor's possession and/or usage.**

Citizens should report all complaints, regarding the illegal use of fireworks, directly to the LOPD Tel-communicator (non-emergency line) at 210-653-0033. If the citizen believes that there may be a fire and/or medical emergency related to the use of fireworks, he/she should dial 9-1-1 and request the LOFD.

National Public Works Week May 21 – 27, 2017

Live Oak’s Public Works Department is responsible for developing and maintaining all public buildings, parks, streets, water systems, and solid waste collection for our community. The people who work in public works are solving some of the toughest problems faced by our communities’ health, safety, comfort and quality of life. This year on May 21 –27, 2017, we proudly salute our public works professionals whose hard work throughout the whole year “connects us” together as a community!

Water Conservation starts with you! It is easy to take this precious resource for granted. Please think about the many ways you can conserve in your daily use of water. Handheld watering is allowed any time, any day. When watering your plants, trees and lawn please follow the rules listed below:

- Year-Round watering restrictions with an irrigation system or hose and sprinkler are permitted any day of the week any time before 11 a.m. or after 7 p.m.
- **Stage 1:** Irrigation or sprinkler watering 1 day per week at any time before 11 a.m. or after 7 p.m.
 - **Stage 2:** Irrigation or sprinkler watering 1 day per week from 7-11 a.m. or 7-11 p.m.
 - **Stage 3:** Irrigation or sprinkler watering only 1 day every other week.

Last Digit of Address determines your watering day: 0 or 1 = Monday; 2 or 3 = Tuesday; 4 or 5 = Wednesday; 6 or 7 = Thursday; 8 or 9 = Friday. No watering on weekends.

EFFECT OF SEDIMENT ON STORMWATER QUALITY



Sediment #1 Pollutant

Erosion is the process by which water flow and wind remove soil, rock, or other material. When wind and water flows diminish, eroded materials become deposited on the ground. The material deposited is called sediment.

One of the biggest manmade sediment releases comes from construction activities. Even relatively minor home-building projects can discharge large amounts of sediment if not properly controlled. The EPA has determined that sediment is a major pollutant.

Sediment can clog storm drains and catch basins and can thereby cause flooding. When runoff carries sediment into local water bodies such as rivers, streams and lakes, it can have a negative effect on water quality, aquatic habitats and human health. We can keep our waters

clean by establishing plants, placing sod, and spreading mulch to help prevent erosion and sedimentation. It is important for stockpiles to be covered and protected from rain and wind. Sediment discharges can also be prevented by installing barriers around the perimeter of the stockpile.

Is My Contractor Registered?



There are many permits pulled for either residential or commercial jobs in our city on a daily basis. One of our most frequently asked question is “Is my contractor a registered contractor within the City of Live Oak?” The answer is simple. Contractors working in Live Oak are required to register annually. Contractors’ licenses issued by Development Services currently are from February 1st to January 31st of the following year. Contractors have the opportunity to renew their licenses every fiscal year or anytime within the current year.

The issued license is the size of a credit card providing the Contractor’s business name and City’s expiration date. If your contractor doesn’t happen to have his contractor’s card in their possession, you can simply contact Development Services to verify their status. During the initial or renewal process of their city contractor’s license, contractors are required to provide proof of liability insurance or a bond to ensure the protection of not only their employees but you as a customer as well. In order to secure a permit, contractors must also show current proof of Liability insurance at the time they submit for their permit. If you would like to see if your selected contractor is registered with us, please visit our website under the Development Services tab for the list of registered contractors.

Side note: If you are a property owner who has a homestead exemption on your home, you may be permitted to perform work without a state license but is subject to inspections and approval in accordance with local and city ordinances. Also, be aware of scammers soliciting to complete repair work from the recent storms. We’ve received calls about roofers claiming to be registered contractors with Live Oak and completing work without a permit or inspections. Don’t be a victim! Development Services is just a phone call away to assist you with contractor information at 210-653-9140, ext. 244.

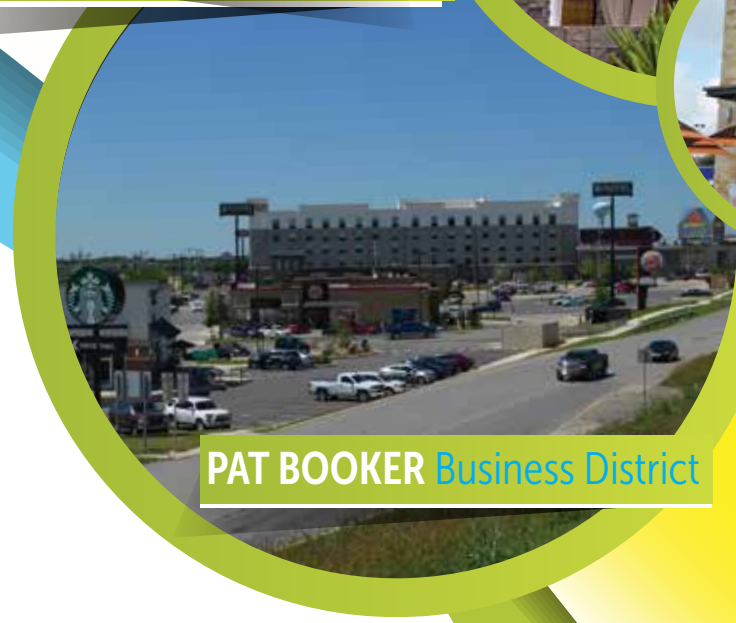
